DEAR LIBERTYVILLE RESIDENT,

When MainStreet Libertyville ran into financial problems in 2007, our residents “voted with their membership dollars” to keep MainStreet active and vital, and to keep **74 days** worth of community events such as **Out to Lunch, Farmer’s Market, PumpkinFest, and Let’s Wine About Winter** thriving.

In 2007, we spoke of the need for ‘annual memberships’ to MainStreet, rather than one-time donations. And while we’re happy to say that MainStreet Libertyville is not in the dire straits of 2007, many folks have not renewed their memberships in the last two years, which is an alarming trend for this non-profit organization.

Libertyville’s MainStreet organization is ranked **#1 in the United States** in residential memberships, above 1,600 other communities with MainStreet organizations. Libertyville was chosen as a **Top 3 MainStreet Destination** by the National Trust for Historic Preservation in 2009. Two years ago, Libertyville was chosen as one of the **Top 100 places to live in America** by *Money Magazine*, in an article that mentioned Libertyville’s active MainStreet organization as one of the key reasons.

MainStreet Libertyville is **not part of Libertyville Village government**. It is a volunteer-based, independent 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, dependent on membership support and donations for its existence.

We ask you to support Libertyville and MainStreet. If you are not a member, please join. If you are a current member, **please renew** and continue your support of Libertyville’s vibrant community. **All memberships are completely tax deductible.**

2009 RACE SHATTERS ATTENDANCE AND FUNDRAISING GOALS

It was a warm night (but not as warm as last year), overcast with a slight chance of rain. Many called it perfect summer running weather. We had to agree. The second-annual **MainStreet Libertyville Twilight Shuffle 5K Run/Walk** which took place in early September was an overwhelming success this year with 875 registered participants, up 20% from last year's event. It was a perfect end to the summer season and a great opportunity to unite residents in our charming and historic downtown area. It was also the most successful fundraiser for MainStreet Libertyville again this year, raising nearly \$22,000 for the organization.

The Twilight Shuffle's 3.12-mile race course is hilly, but participants were cheered on by an endless line of enthusiastic spectators who filled the course with encouraging signs and even set up neighborhood cheering parties. Said one blogger of the event, *"The Mainstreet crew did a FABULOUS job this year. What a great race! And the community...what a great place to live and run. There were so many stretches of the race where residents lined the streets and really made the 5K fun with their*

cheering and words of encouragement. For me, that was the best part...the camaraderie and sense of community that I felt throughout the run." Well, 'anonymous runner,' we couldn't have said it any better. This is a great town filled with great people, and an event like the Twilight Shuffle ties that all together.

Overall male and female winners of the 2009 Twilight Shuffle were Trey Robinson of Evanston, with a time of 16:19, and Christine Handel of Libertyville, with a time of 20:29. We gave out 24 youth awards this year with a grand total of 36 recognized winners. Next year, we plan to feature family awards and third-place winner recognition in each age category, too.

We'd like to thank our generous sponsors whose financial contributions and donations of everything from signage to refreshments (and everything in between) made our event bigger and better-looking than ever. Also, a big thank you to our volunteers who gave up their evening to help with our event. We know how busy Labor Day weekend can be for everyone, so we're

extra appreciative that close to 100 people were willing to help keep our race safe, fun, clean, and organized.

Next year join us for another fabulous Twilight Shuffle 5K which will be held on Sunday, September 5, 2010 at 6pm. We will be launching a new Twilight Shuffle website after the holidays with more information about race registration, volunteer and sponsorship opportunities, new family awards, and much more. Watch for it!
